O U R MISSION

MAY WE BOAST IN CHRIST ALONE

One of the unique characteristics of Christianity is that we are to boast of our weaknesses. Sure, Buddhism emphasizes suffering to overcome the self, but it does not have an aim at finding help through our weaknesses from an outside source. This is why the Apostle Paul could write in 2 Corinthians 12:9, "Therefore, I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may rest upon me." It is the power of Christ resting upon us that gives us strength and constancy that God is faithful despite our circumstances. Our suffering has a person and purpose behind it – God and His Glory!

I do not know how to say this other than this was the hardest year of my tenure as your pastor, mostly because of the loss of our Associate Pastor of Teaching and my father, Phil Stairs, as he went home to be with Jesus. This was accompanied by 6 other people who passed from death to life – Curtis Cutting, Norman Hamlyn, Shirley Cameron, Muriel Harris, Thelma Reid and Ed Kuun. May we boast in our weakness and profound learning of how to grieve and mourn. We are blessed if we mourn because we will be comforted.

Some experts have described churches as being in seasons of planting, watering, pruning or harvesting. What season do you think we are in? We planted Restoration in 2018, by sending out 10% of our church to south Cambridge. This was quickly followed up by the other seasons. We have worked to water our church through the prayer and the proclamation of God's Word in Ezra, the Beatitudes and Nehemiah. We also tried to evaluate our systems and programs, especially in the most critical mandate we have of making disciples and have made changes such as a renewed small group emphasis and transitioning from Next Chapter classes to Prayer Encounters on Wednesdays with the goal of becoming a house of

prayer. This watering and pruning poses us for future growth as we recreate our property.

However, it has also been a year of harvesting. The Lord saved 20 people at Temple's local ministry (a recent record) and at least another 36 people through Temple's global ministry such as in Togo last January. We have also added 44 new members this year and have seen 8 people get baptized. Praise the Lord!

One of our big blessings this year was the hiring of Jason Elliotson as our Pastor of Discipleship. Jason's evangelistic heart is moving us forward in having a love for the lost. He was accompanied by the hiring of our summer interns Caleb Gagnier and Aaron Hoyte. Investing in these leaders has been an amazing blessing and was providential, especially since we were playing "5 on 3" for the last half of the year with Linda Morrell on sick leave for a month's surgery, Tara Hoyte on parental leave from July through December and Pastor Dan Walker on sick leave since late November with a heart condition.

God was faithful, too, in that we hosted some great events and speakers in Dr. Laura Lewis from

Pregnancy Care Canada at our Chesterton Lecture, Sheila Wray-Gregoire and her Girl Talk on sexual discipleship and Gracia Burnham giving her testimony of her husband's martyrdom as a missionary in the Philippines. These speakers all reminded us of the brokenness in our world and why we are on mission to turn broken people into whole people.








CONNECT WITH OTHERS {DISCIPLESHIP}

2019 was a year of great change as we have pressed into our mandate from our Saviour to make disciples of Jesus Christ (Matthew 28:18-20), to help each other become more like Jesus in every aspect of life.

Next Chapter classes were moved for restructuring and to make room for our churchwide Prayer Encounter on Wednesday nights in order to lay a foundation of prayer upon which our church will grow. Another important restructuring in 2019 involves the ramping up of our small group ministry in order to provide safe, intentional, and focused contexts for growing in Christlikeness. In 2019, we have seen the start of training to better support and equip small group leaders, the launch of three new groups, and 118 people included in our ten small groups. Creating a culture of being discipled into Jesus Christ and making disciples of Jesus Christ is at the heart of the Temple vision.

Some of the ways that we have sought to do that this year is by moving all our classrooms, from age 2 right up to grade 5 onto the same curriculum so that all our kids are learning the same thing and have a continued experience from when they enter into the first class until they finish.

We did this by hiring Aaron Hoyte as a Summer Intern for TBC Kids who, with the help of Youth Intern Caleb Gagnier and Pastor Dan Walker, ran a week long VBS and a week long Sports Camp. The amazing God stories that we have from those camps are that we got to see 6 kids make professions of faith and countless more learn what it means to love Jesus better.

As we moved into September we were excited to prepare for construction by moving into our current interim classrooms that saw us moving closer together, allowing for easier access for parents.

We capped the year off by announcing the hiring of a pastor dedicated to Children's Discipleship, Kyle Rhora. Praise God for his faithfulness through these times of flux. We truly see His hand all along the way!

MEN'S MINISTRIES

The vision for Men's Ministry at Temple Baptist Church is in line with the church's mission with Jesus to, "Turn broken people into whole people who multiply Christfollowers." We want to see broken men (and who among us is not broken in some way?) transformed into men whose lives reflect the values and character traits of this vision.

As the church building undergoes a significant refresh, we think about the parallel refresh each of us must daily undergo to be more Christ-like.

These ministries continue to be a blessing to all involved and we are grateful for the assistance these ladies provide.









BENEVOLENCE MINISTRY

As Jesus calls us to care for widows and orphans in their distress (James 1:27) and to care for the least of Jesus' children (Matthew 25:40), we as a church work that out in many ways.

One way in which we as a church have been the hands and feet of Jesus was displayed in receiving and meeting needs in our immediate church community and in our broader city community. Our church responsibly assisted in focused humanitarian relief for 12 families last year, in addition to the many volunteers in our midst who assist with the various city shelters and kitchens.



3.0 UPDATE - RESTORATION CHURCH

Restoration Church experienced its full year of existence in 2019! Throughout this year, we have experienced a ton of change, struggle, growth, and things to thank God for. We have needed and appreciated the tons of prayer and support that our mother church, Temple Baptist, continues to give to us. We certainly could not do this without first, the Lord, and second, Temple.

RC sees an average attendance of 60-65 people every week at our Sunday Celebrations, with a total reach of around 95 people currently. We thank the Lord for all the people He has brought to us from the community. This gratitude is even more intensified when you consider that currently there are 27 with us from the Temple Baptist Church core team that planted RC in September 2018, which means that 72% of our church has come to us in the last year and a half!

We had the privilege of experiencing our first baptism this past summer, seeing 4 babies born into the church, had our first intern Liam Freer, join us, and have seen major connections into our gathering place, Southwood Secondary School. Praise the Lord.

During the last year God has also taught us a lot! As we have explored the books of 1-2 Samuel and Colossians, as well as the themes of evangelism, restoration, and incarnation, He has changed us into

who we presently are, and given us values that our church operates in.

The first value is dependence. We have grown in our dependence upon God and in His power to change our church and our city. In view of this, in 2019, we began a Restoration Prayer event where our church just gathers to pray on the first Tuesday of each month. We see this as the most important thing that we do.

The second value is participation. Our Sunday Celebrations have become a time where all gather to bring their act of service before God. There is a sense of sincerity and intimacy.

The third value is home. We have really discovered that it is the home in which primary discipleship happens, not only in biological families, but in spiritual families. We launched home Bible Studies in 2019, as well as House Church, which is a time to encourage one another, eat together, and share communion together on the last Sunday evening of the month.

Finally, the fourth value is neighbouring. Through our connections with New Hope Housing Co-op, and Southwood as a whole, we have been able to do BBQ's, carnivals, door to door evangelism, etc. in our community. We want to be present and faithful to our neighbours.

We look forward to 2020 as God continues to change us into His image.


DONOR ANALYSIS


