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GROWING IN CHRIST

Most of us thought on January 1st, 2020, that we had a clear vision of the year and expected life to be pretty much the same or be better. However, 2020 was nothing like any of us had experienced before due to the COVID-19 pandemic, which forced us to stay at home and isolated for much of the year. As I reflect on the vear. I echo Charles Dickens' words in his classic novel A Tale of Two Cities, "It was the best of times, it was the worst of times, it was the age of wisdom, it was the age of foolishness, it was the epoch of belief, it was the epoch of incredulity, it was the season of Light, it was the season of Darkness, it was the spring of hope, it was the winter of despair, we had everything before us. we had nothing before us, we were all going direct to Heaven, we were all going direct the other way." My humble and limited assessment is that Temple is actually stronger than when we began the year. This is because of our great God and His work in us as we attempted to grow in Christ - our theme for the year.

Certainly, we would love to all be together in person again. However, every crisis presents an opportunity for God to grow us. Here are some of the ways God took the proverbial "lemons and made them lemonade" by growing and making us stronger:

• More contact with our church members as our Elders contacted households bi-weekly. Ironically, we became more "high-touch" when isolated.

• More "participation" in our worship services as we had others beyond the Staff welcome people and give announcements. At a time when less participation could occur in-person, more participation could occur online.

• More donations were received as we moved to almost exclusive online giving. Despite a tough economy and reduced expenses, we actually ended with a surplus and gave away an extra \$10,000 to local ministry partners and affiliates because of the Lord's generosity through you.

• More God stories. For years we longed to hear more of your testimonies.

· More online presence and digital discipleship.

• More people attending small groups. Our God who always knows the future had us providentially move to small groups from Sunday night services just before the pandemic began.

• More parents took the responsibility to disciple their children.

• More agility and flexibility as our team pivoted to deliver ministry in new ways.

• More understanding that the church exists beyond Sunday morning while gaining more of an understanding the importance of in-person gatherings.

• More mentoring through interning Caleb Gagnier, Zoe & Isaac Watson, Jessie Stairs and Shelby Henderson.

• More outreach and helping those on the margins through two food drives, and drive-thru outreaches at Halloween and Christmas.

· More grief counseling through Griefshare.

 More weddings with Jeff & Presley Hornsby and Zoe & Isaac Watson

• More answered prayer including Pastor Dan Walker returning to work after a 4+ month leave with a heart condition and our Elder Chair David Pinkerton surviving a horrific bicycle accident.

• More networking with other churches to share best practices.

• More recreation of our property as construction continued of The Master's Plan 4.0.

I want to thank God for my family, Elders, Staff, Deacons and the Build Team, especially as they took on more responsibility while I was on Sabbatical in June and July. It is one of God's great gifts to me to serve alongside you and these choice leaders as we grow in Christ.

CHILDREN'S MINISTRIES

When I look back on this past year I certainly could lament many things, but I prefer to see the work that God has done in our midst even through circumstances that I certainly would not have chosen. As a church, we have focused on the theme of Growing in Christ and I for one have seen much growth in Christ personally, as a church, and as families of Temple Baptist Church. Truth be told, we have been given the opportunity to study the Word of God as families in a way that we may not have had we not been forced to change how we did Kids' Ministry. While some things looked different, many of our main focuses remained intact. First, we were still able to focus on God's Word! Over the course of the year we studied the life of Jesus, the Book of Acts in 12 weeks, Zechariah 1-9, as well as special Sundays that focused on Thanksgiving, Missions, Easter, and Christmas. Not only have we stayed focused on the Word, outreach, and fun, but by the end of 2020, we officially took possession of our new kids' space, the TBC Kids Woodlot. DISCIPLESHIP

2020 was a year of great challenge for discipleship as COVID-19 swept the globe and public restriction pushed small groups, boot camps, and prayer meetings to online formats. In spite of these challenges, we saw attendance growth with 2 new small groups formed and 26 new people joining small groups during this season. Small groups have been an important place for continued connection and mutual ministry during a season where the path of least resistance has been to disconnect and isolate.

Prayer has continued to be prioritized as Wednesday night Prayer Encounters have continued faithfully along with Thursday morning Men's prayer and Women's prayer retreats. In addition, we launched the first of our Discipleship Bootcamps, running an Old Testament & New Testament Bible Survey course, a Biblical Interpretation & Hermeneutics course, and an Evangelism & Apologetics course.

Creating a culture of being discipled into Jesus Christ and making disciples of Jesus Christ is at the heart of the Temple vision.







WORSHIP ARTS

The social distancing and isolation we've experienced this past year changed the way we celebrated and worshiped our great God together, moving our weekly celebration in March from our auditorium to online, where, for much of the year, we produced service videos weekly in a socially distanced manner. Audio and video recording and engineering came together with content creation to produce online services to help us stay connected with "normal" (ish) routines and practices. Many volunteered their time and smart phones to show different smiling faces to welcome and encourage us with testimonies each week.

In the fall, our worship arts teams carried us into the live streaming world as we met back in the auditorium at a reduced capacity than before. We are thankful to the Lord for His provision in this way as further COVID-19 restrictions eventually prohibited in-person gatherings outside the ten people required to produce services for live streaming.

In addition to the "normal" week-to-week services, our worship arts teams delivered a powerful message in the "Christmas Isn't Cancelled" drivethru tour for Christmas 2020. Christmas can't be cancelled because it happened and our Saviour lives!

The 25 minute video had 175 plays on our church website and had **over 2.5K views** on Facebook due to people sharing it.

Christmas Eve Service

The Christmas Eve Service had 286 views on Facebook, 27 views on the website and 49 views on YouTube.

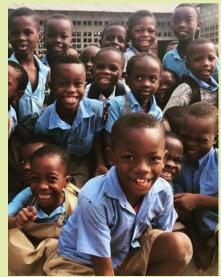

"I stretch out my hands to You; my soul thirsts for You like a parched land." Psalm 143:6 ESV

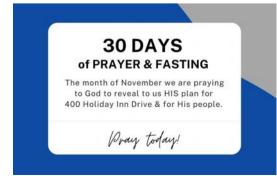

3.0 RESTORATION CHURCH

What a year this has been! If God would have revealed to me that in the first couple years of Restoration Church, we would have to weather a lengthened teachers' strike which caused us to temporarily lose our Sunday gathering space, only to be followed by a worldwide pandemic, I'm not sure we would have done this. As everyone knows, this has been a challenging and trying year, however, God has been so good, and Restoration Church has grown, remained resilient, flexible, and our trust in God has increased.

In the fall before lockdown, RC was seeing an average attendance of 75-80 people every week at our Sunday Celebrations, with a total reach of well over 100 people currently. We thank the Lord for all the people He has brought to us from the community. We are seeing a movement of people that have a church background coming back to the Lord.

During the last year God has also taught us a lot! As we have explored the books of Ecclesiastes and Luke, as well as the themes of revival, contribution, and dependence, He has changed us into who we presently are, and given us values that our church operates under.

The first value is dependence. This year more than ever, we have had to rely on God for direction, wisdom and growth. We continue to exercise prayer as our first step of action before anything else.

The second value is participation. We have been everywhere, man. As everyone is aware, our normal Sunday morning gatherings have been anything but normal this year as we jumped around from House Churches, Sunday evening and afternoon gatherings at other churches, and outdoors on a farm. In the fall, we were able to secure an amazing space called Tapestry Hall, just west of downtown Galt. Please pray that we will be able to get back in there soon.

The third value is home. We have really had to lean into the value where discipleship primarily happens in the home. We have started recording virtual kids' lessons for the parents to be able to teach their children on their own. As well, we have seen a greater urgency to connect with one another in smaller groups in Bible Studies. Currently, around 75% of our adults are in weekly Bible Studies discipling one another.

Finally, the fourth value is neighbouring. More than any other value, this one has been the most difficult to live out in a pandemic year. Part of being a neighbour is presence, which is at a minimum this year. Despite the difficulty, we have been challenged to think smaller, as in, who are the people God has put directly in front of us. We currently are preparing future opportunities for door-to-door evangelism, as well as assisting with single mothers in need. We are praying that God would open many doors for the Gospel this year in West Galt. We look forward to 2021 as God continues to change us into His image.

Thank you Temple for the opportunity to go into the community on an almost daily basis. We as a team felt that praying for our community went very well. We also reached a lot of people and had a few very good conversations with others. We had the opportunity to pray over other people in the neighbourhood. Our events, such as "A Night in the Park" that we ran went well once the government opened up regulations for public places.

We found that handing out flyers for the food drive was well received by the community and they valued our church's care for others. We dropped off hundreds of slips inviting people to connect with us for prayer and then had very organic conversations with those that were not busy working from home or watching their children. People were very open with about personal issues and oftentimes us acknowledged what we were doing and thanked us for thinking of the community. We also felt that video making went well and it will be a valuable resource for the church. We are excited to see how the videos will be used. Working with production on Sundays filming intros and outros was nice too. Gather.town was a great initiative that was fun to have tried to incorporate for the pandemic season. We also felt honoured to help people in the church when they needed things moved and being the hands and feet of the church in a literal sense. We loved having some time to brainstorm creative ways to reach the community and build relationships.

It was nice to walk and witness because we prayed over a lot of the neighbourhoods and spoke to people that were out with dogs and children and we prayed for several of them with family/friends in hospitals.

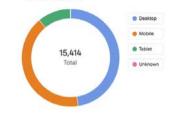

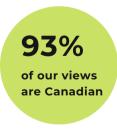

Because of COVID-19, our youth and children's ministries have gone online. Praise the Lord for the technology that we have that allows us to connect at a distance. Pray for these ministries as plans are made for their resumption on-site during 2021.
