

COMMUNITY OUTREACH

One of the many wonderful observations at the Market is to see a customer who purchases a basket often. They then mention that they have a neighbour who would benefit from a basket and purchase another one to give away. Keeping this program at a low cost with the help of the community and extra donations allows for people to not only afford it for themselves, but have the ability to help their neighbours and family in need.

During the last round of restrictions that came to Ontario in December, we had to change how we offered the program and have no volunteers to maximize safety. This time without volunteers highlighted how they really are the heart of the work we are doing. We have heard from folks getting baskets how much they miss them and how helpful they are. We hear from the volunteers that they miss their Thursday afternoon routine,



and cannot wait to be back at it again. We can provide quality food and an equitable food system, but it's the volunteers who create the community. And we are grateful for each and every one of them. Thank you, TBC!

Things to know:

The Mobile Food Market ran every Thursday from July to December and there were 11 Market Volunteers from TBC.

We sold 1,382 baskets of food!

The TBC Body Shoppe started in September and there are 4 volunteers who handed over **70** bags of hygiene supplies.



Best Foot Forward (Employment Readiness) ran a two evening workshop in co-ordination with Cambridge Career Connections which had **10 students**.

For the community we helped with Fun Fridays (free cold treats), the drive-in movie night, a back to school bike repair day and a Christmas Dinner Campaign to encourage local families.





Having TBC's services streamed on Facebook and YouTube has been a great way for TBC to connect with our church family as well as those not of our church family who are unable to attend in person. As a moderator, I have enjoyed the opportunity to provide a personal connection during the



service with the viewers.




